Appreciating Water as Spiritual Practice

Happy New Year, Bethlehem! As I've thought about intentions (aka the "R-word"...resolutions) for the New Year, I've been reminded of one of my core beliefs about spirituality: I believe that even the most basic or seemingly mundane of our daily activities can be incorporated as part of our spiritual practices. I strive to

understand my life in an interconnected, holistic way. My physical health is connected to my emotional health is connected to my spiritual health.

One of my intentions this year is to drink more water! In 2016, "Water is Life" became the rallying cry of individuals protesting the Dakota Access Pipeline in North Dakota. This spiritual man-

tra offered by the American Indian Nations leading the struggle was a blessing for me. It reminded me of the foundational importance of water in my individual existence and of the need to protect our water for the sake of our collective well-being. This summer, as I joined Bethlehem's Flint Habitat trip, I was reminded again that "Water is Life."

Water is Life. Therefore, it is no surprise that water is a central component of so many religious traditions, including Christianity. We could spend many hours exploring water's significance in Christianity and in life processes. In this article, though, I want to offer a simple prayer/meditation that could transform the simple act of drinking a glass of water each morning to be part of our daily spiritual practice.



A Prayer for Water

In the morning, as you prepare to fill a glass of water, notice your breath - the Spirit - moving in and through you.

When you turn on the faucet:

- Notice the water filling your cup.
- What do you see? Bubbles, clear water?
- Today, your cup is full! In the words of Psalm 23:5: Your cup runneth over!

Before you drink the water:

- Imagine where the water has been
 - o In clouds and rivers and streams. Think about the wonders of the Earth, and the many ways in which it is all connected by water.
 - o Give thanks for the water, and the ways in which we are connected.
- Think about the way the water got into your home, into your cup.
 - o Through pipes and filters.
 - o Give thanks for the people who made the pipes and filters; for the metals from the Earth, which made them possible. Give thanks for the public infrastructure and city employees who maintain the pipes, and the policies and standards that ensure the water is safe for our consumption.

As you drink the water:

- Imagine how the water which has traveled atmosphere, Earth, and community will travel through your body. Into your mouth, down your esophagus, to your stomach, and beyond.
 - o Give thanks for the ways in which it will refresh and cleanse you. For the ways in which the oxygen from the water sustains, nourishes, and replenishes your cells. The building blocks of life.

As you finish your water, say a prayer of thanksgiving, name your gratitudes, set your positive intentions for the day. Today, my cup is full! My cup runneth over! Psalm 23:5

Then, immediately, drink your coffee ;)

What a wonderful generous congregation we have. During the Advent Season we had so much giving of time, talent, money, gift cards, clothing that we shared with our congregation and our community.




asked to speak to any member of the Worship Ministry Team.

Women of Bethlehem would like to share the good news about how the money was distributed from the BAZAAR that took place in November. After tallying all the income and expenses we made a profit of \$3,174.66.

We gave 50% to Bethlehem for the Property Improvement Fund	\$1,587.33

WREATHS ACROSS AMERICA

At our last veterans breakfast Dave Gilmore shared his experience with placing wreaths on graves at Arlington Cemetery. In our December Visitor article it explained how this annual event began. Wreaths were donated to make sure every veteran had a wreath to honor there service and sacrifice. As a result of that article several Bethlehem members and friends made donations.

On December 16, 2017, 65

semi trucks drove from Harrington, Maine to Arlington National Cemetery, stopping at schools, monuments and various communities along the way to Respect, Honor and Teach. 244,700 wreaths were laid at Arlington by more than 75,000 volunteers – largest crowd to ever participate. It took 7 weeks to make the wreaths. They were placed in under 2 hours. Over 500 trucks volunteer to go to 1,422 participating locations around the country. Volunteers in all states placed 1,565,000 wreaths this year. Wreaths are not placed to 'decorate' the markers



but to respect and honor, not the death, but the life of the veteran. Eligibility for in-ground and Columbarium burial at Arlington National Cemetery may be found on Arlington's website:

www.arlingtoncemetery.mil . January 20, 2018 is clean-up day which is also done by volunteers. Everything in this program is done by either donation and/or volunteers. There are no government funds used for anything. December 15, 2018 is the date for next year's

event. A donation of \$15.00/wreath may be made on their website **www.wreathsacrossamerica.org**. Remembrance Tree Program – another way to remember a veteran with a living memorial – a Free Program. Give the information about a loved one and they create a dog tag. Pick out a evergreen in their forest, the dog tag is placed at the trunk of the tree. Tips of the tree are harvested very three years and used to make the wreaths each December.
