# Page 2 From Your President's Desk:



I hope you were able to attend the rededication of the Willimann Fellowship Hall on "Homecoming" Sunday. It was a fine celebration of the culmination of refurbishing and installing air conditioning.



Now that the work is done and we've received the final bill, there's **very good news**: We won't have to borrow as much as the congregation authorized. Rather than the \$120,000 the governing body authorized borrowing, we shall have to borrow about \$67,000!

This windfall is due in part to lower costs (and thus less contingency spending built into the estimate) and in part to those who have already donated or pledged to the capital campaign. Thanks to all!

Our Covenant Association held its spring meeting Saturday, March 30, at Bethlehem. I thank all those who had a hand in making that event a success: individuals from the Welcome, Fellowship, and Member Care ministry teams; our organist, pastor, and various other volunteers. (Rather than offend only a few folks by omitting their names, I chose to list no names!)

One attendee, Pat Barnes-McConnell from East Lansing, shared a mantra from the Carol J. Greer Community Learning Center. She has found it is a great way to focus children's attention and energy. When she says "123!" the children immediately stop what they're doing and respond with:

#### I MUST:

Dream big Because I don't have to settle for less;

Work hard Because I want to be among the best;

Have self-discipline Because achieving my dream depends on it;

I can do all these things because I am intricately and wonderfully made, and so are you.

# **News from the Education Ministry Team**

# **Lenten Mission Project**

This year we wanted to raise money to help buy the materials to make cooking stoves for families in Guatemala in Central America. The response has been fantastic! So far we had raised \$2000 by the time this article went to print. Thank you, Bethlehem! This mission project shows us how we can work together to do Christ's calling to help those in most need. We are proud of our youth for leading this effort and grateful for the response from our entire congregation.

Our mission project this year is a project brought to our attention by Della DiPietro. She came and spoke to the youth group last fall and explained the project. Many families in Guatemala have only a pit in the middle of a dirt floor as their only source of heat and a place to cook. It is inefficient, and wood smoke fills the room, causing health issues because there is no ventilation.

Della has been involved with a group called Michigan Helps for many years. A group of physicians, nurses, and support volunteers go to Guatemala to perform surgeries for some of the poorest individuals. The surgeries are varied—repairs of cleft lips and palates, club feet, and eye surgeries, for example. The patients come from villages far and wide, and all the expenses are covered. It takes a large team of people (including Della and her husband, Gary Kade) to make these trips possible.

Over the years, Michigan Helps volunteers identified a concern that affected many of the families. Although the surgeries were lifechanging, patients were being sent back to unhealthy homes. The fire pits lead to health problems. One volunteer came up with a design for a simple stove. Now volunteers go into the homes and set up these stoves: \$250 covers the cost of materials and installation.

About Evicted: "Desmond's book introduces readers to eight families struggling to make ends



meet. Arleen is a single mother trying to raise her two sons on the \$20 a month she has left after paying for their rundown apartment. Scott is a nurse consumed by a heroin addiction. Lamar, a man with no legs and a neighborhood full of boys to look after, tries to work his way out of debt. Vanetta participates in a botched stickup after her hours are cut. All are spending almost everything they have on shelter, and all have fallen behind.

The fates of these families are in the hands of two landlords: Sherrena Tarver, a former schoolteacher turned inner-city entrepreneur, and Tobin Charney, who runs one of the worst trailer parks in Milwaukee. While they are fond of some of their tenants, as Tarver puts it, "Love don't pay the bills." She moves to evict Arleen and her boys a few days before Christmas."
