Page 2 From Your President's Desk:





My phone's been ringing off the hook! My email in-box is overflowing! Carrier pigeons are flying into my windows! The congregation noticed: the President made a mistake!

At the Annual Meeting on Sunday June 9 I forgot to have the Governing Body approve the minutes of the past few Congregational Meetings (we had a few, since the last Annual Meeting!) "What?" you say? "I didn't contact the President about that. I didn't even notice the omission." Well, actually, you're right. No one contacted me. No phone calls, no emails and certainly no birds.

During my tenure as your President, I've presided over six Congregational Meetings: January 27, 2019, September 23, 2018, June 17, 2018, April 15, 2018, January 28, 2018, and June 9, 2019. All of these minutes are available on the Bethlehem website's "Church Governance" page, beneath the "About Us" menu item. On that page, there a link to <u>Congregational Meeting Minutes</u>. One document listed, the minutes for the January 28, 2018 meeting, is different from all the others: it says the minutes from the previous three Congregational Meetings, including the 2017 Annual Meeting were approved.

I must be a "forward looking guy" because it never occurred to me to place that business on the agenda (nor to distribute an agenda!) For this failure in discharging my official duties, I humbly beg your forgiveness and announce a new policy, adopted at the June meeting of the newly reconstituted Leadership Council: henceforth, the Council will approve minutes from Congregational and Annual Meetings.

As "Robert's Rules for Dummies" says:

"If the assembly isn't meeting again for a long time (if at all), such as in annual membership meetings or conventions of delegates, the process of approving the minutes is delegated to a special committee or an executive board. This practice produces an approved and legal record of the meeting shortly after the meeting closes but before memories of what occurred in the meeting fade.

On a personal note, I want to thank the Bethlehem congregation and staff for your support for me and more especially my wife at the passing of her mother, Sylvia Weber. It was only recently I'd gotten a place on the "family photo" wall: after 20+ years, I'm sticking with the family! She was a fine lady.

On Monday, we volunteered at the Food Bank of Eastern Michigan where we worked with other volunteer groups to sort through 11,000 pounds of produce/bread and 8,461 pounds of non-food items! Wow!! The Food Bank is always impressed with the efficiency and dedication of our group. Unfortunately, Lily's battle with an illness kept her from staying the whole week with the group, but she was able to tough it out enough to join us at the Food Bank this day. Carol's friend Sue joined us for the day as well!

On Tuesday, we met up with several other volunteers at a new build site in Gaines, MI to work together in putting trusses on the house (with the help of a crane). Kris enjoyed his first taglining experience!

On Wednesday, we gathered back at the worksite to begin building the base of the roof with OSB, but were unfortunately cut short due to storms headed our way. That night, Gaines experienced 3 inches of rain which created a giant mud pit at the worksite and unfortunately canceled our work day with Habitat on Thursday. Knowing that there is never a shortage of work back at the Food Bank, we checked in with them on Thursday morning and ended up helping out there instead— we were determined to work! We assisted in sorting many more pallets of frozen meats and goods.

In addition to our volunteer hours with Habitat and the Food Bank, Bethlehem was able to make a generous monetary donation to each organization.

Thanks to everyone who contributed financially to the trip! Despite some hot and rainy weather, we had a great time, got lots of work done, and represented Bethlehem well!
