From Your President's Desk:

Yet another restroom has been refurbished at BUCC: the room previously known as "Men's" across the hall from the church office. Even before the new tile, fixtures, and paint were in place, it had been dubbed a "Family Restroom" and now is open to all.



As one who has made use of that room many times during my ten year tenure at Bethlehem, I appreciate the upgrade and feel more "at home." Yes, as I am named "John," I was keenly aware early in life that my name was a somewhat impolite way of referring to "the facilities." When we had our special guest preacher from Germany this summer who is about to become a Lutheran Bishop, he mentioned it was a good bet to address any random male at BUCC as "John." I taught him the second American slang meaning of this name and feel I advanced the cause of our Christian brotherhood accordingly.

Seriously, I did want to take a moment and reflect on this latest step in our stewardship of our physical facilities. The cost of refurbishing this restroom was estimated at around \$10,000 and while it was not in our annual budget (and shouldn't have been) nor was it included in the Fellowship Hall/air-conditioning effort, Leadership Council approved it as the next item on a long list of "to do's." Sometimes, ya gotta have faith!

Fear not: this is not a kick-off of a mini-fund-raiser! It's been paid for! We received an anonymous gift of \$10,000 earmarked for this effort, just as it was being completed. As Pastor John continually points out (and it is a point worth remarking), we are a generous group of people. Seeing the evidence of that generosity literally around every corner at Bethlehem is an inspiring reminder and challenge to look and see how we also can be generous. It doesn't have to be at the \$10,000 level (for which you get a tote bag), and it doesn't have to be monetary. Making generosity a way of life really is its own reward.

As one of life's little coincidences, my wife and I are reading Gary Chapman's fine book "Love as a Way of Life" and last night, our study group discussed chapter seven, "Generosity." I recommend the book.

Lily Tinker-Fortel Granted "Lay Ministry Standing"

In the winter of 2018, Lily Tinker Fortel, Bethlehem's Minister of Spiritual Growth & Develop-



ment, began the Member in Discernment (MID) (also known as In-Care) process.

She came to Bethlehem United Church of Christ already with a Master Degree in Divinity. She took Clinical Pastoral Education and a UCC Heritage & Polity course. She has a Pastor/Mentor in Rev. Joe Jefferys of Chelsea First Congregational United Church of Christ and she has met with the UCC Church & Ministry Team (Covenant Association) in East Lansing which Joe chairs and our Pastor John Kennedy serves.

At the request of our Leadership Council, that committee has unanimously granted Lily "Lay Ministry Standing" This "standing" authorizes Lily to officiate at weddings, funerals, and lead/bless the sacraments of Baptism and Holy Communion at Bethlehem UCC at the request and direction of the pastor. Licensing is always authorized for the maximum of 1- year at a time and can be renewed each year.

As a part of the newly revised UCC practice with Members in Discernment, Leadership Council has approved a "Local Church Discernment Committee" (LCDC), to help shepherd Lily in her journey: that group is Patti Maki, Jane Ziesemer, Sue Muir, and Jenell Buday.

Referring to Lily as "Pastor Lily" is very appropriate. Lily may also wear a clergy collar, robe or alb, if she so chooses. A stole is presented at ordination. (For those who have inquired, the title of "Reverend" (Rev.) is granted to ordained clergy. Stoles are worn by ordained clergy).

Lily's new status will be recognized as a part of the 10 AM worship service some Sunday in October, to be determined, followed by a special gluten-free Coffee Connection in Fellowship Hall.

Please watch for the date and plan to be in worship to celebrate this milestone both in Lily's spiritual journey and in Bethlehem's proud tradition of lifting up those called to ministry.

SPIRIT DAY is a means of speaking out against LGBTQ bullying and standing with LGBTQ youth, who disproportionately face bullying and harassment because of their identities.

Pledging to "go purple" on Spirit Day is a way for everyone to visibly show solidarity with LGBTQ youth and to take part in the largest anti-bullying campaign in the world.

We will discuss how churches can and have been harmful to LGBTQ individuals and how we can all do better.

Sunday, October 20 - Wear PURPLE

We are inviting the congregation to wear purple to worship on Sunday October 20 to visibly show solidarity with LGBTQ youth and to take part in an anti-bullying campaign,

On Thursday, **October 17th** there will be showing of an episode of Queer Eye, Season Two, titled "God Bless Gay" which will be held in the Youth Room along with Youth Night. The congregation is invited to come for pizza and to watch and discuss it with the youth.

October 17th is called "Spirit Day" for the LGBTQ community. "Spirit Day is an annual LGBTQ awareness day observed on the third Thursday in October. Started in 2010 by Canadian teenager Brittany McMillan, it was initially created in response to a rash of widely publicized bullying-related suicides of gay school students in 2010, including that of Tyler Clementi." Each year on Spirit Day, millions go purple to support LGBTQ youth.

October 20th – WEAR PURPLE. We are inviting the congregation to wear PURPLE to church on Sunday October 20 to observe "Spirit Day".

On **Friday, November 1**, the Penny Stamps Speaker Series at U-M is holding a special event at Bethlehem Church, "John Cameron Mitchell in Conversation" Mitchell's creative work proudly focuses on explorations of sexuality and gender, celebrating nuance and individuality in all of its many forms." "Best known for his double Tony Award-winning rock opera and 2001 film *Hedwig and the Angry Inch*, Mitchell is an actor, playwright, screenwriter, and director. Off the stage, Mitchell works in the realm of feature film, documentaries, and advertising for Dior and Agent Provocateur. He has appeared in numerous acting roles in film and television, including a recurring character on the HBO series *Girls*, as Andy Warhol in the 2016 season of HBO's *Vinyl*, and recently as a series cast member in Hulu's *Shrill*. The following night, on **November 2**, Mitchell will be at Hill Auditorium to revisit songs from *Hedwig* and preview songs from his upcoming musical podcast *Anthem*.



From the Cemetery Board

Summer may be coming to an end but improvements at the cemetery continue. This summer, asphalt millings were applied to portions of the dirt roadways and other sections of the paved road were seal coated. The City of Ann Arbor completed sidewalk repairs along Jackson Road at the front of the cemetery. Two storm damaged trees were removed and head stones affected were uprighted and repaired. Arrangements can be made to repair damaged headstones by contacting the church office. These repairs are made at the expense of the owner.



Due to monetary constraints, a planned refurbishing of the Memorial Garden was not done. Instead, the sexton, Brad Bouchie, has begun removing the overgrown bushes around the garden and the memorial plaque has been moved to the center of the area. Currently there is one bench in the garden but there are places for more benches and a large cross. If you are interested in donating any of these please contact a member of the Cemetery Board.
