Dear Bethlehem Family,

I want to express my sincere appreciation to all of you. By the time this Visitor article comes out, we will have concluded the collection and initial summary of both the Congregational Self-reflection survey and the Pastoral Evaluation survey. You may remember that in late September, our Leadership Council approved the distribution of both of these surveys to you, our church family members. The surveys were distributed by providing electronic links to each survey tool which were posted in our previous Visitor, our refrigerator pages, and our Friday email messages. In addition, Council requested that paper copies of each survey tool be available for pick-up in our church office. Council also requested that paper copies of both surveys be mailed to church members who do not have an email address on file with our office. Finally, to get the message out, I made several announcements at our Sunday services. I am very pleased with the responses from all of you to our (Council) request for your opinions and feedback. At the time of writing this message (10/14), I can report that we have received 56 completed Congregational self-reflection surveys (40 through the electronic links and 16 on paper) and 43 Pastor surveys (33 through electronic links and 10 via paper). The number of responses are substantially more than Council received when we sent these out to the Congregation 3 years ago. In addition, I have received numerous additional communications from church members during this same period. In my opinion, this incredible response speaks to the overall involvement, dedication, and commitment you have for our church family and our church leadership. The links have been taken down but I will gladly accept any outstanding paper copies for those who forgot to submit your feedback by the requested date (October 17th).

What happens now? The next step involves summarizing all results and creating a final report for each survey. The congregational survey summary report will be shared with Leadership Council and our ministry teams. It is my hope we will use this report as the bedrock for developing a collective strategic plan. Developing such a plan is a primary responsibility, identified in our by-laws, for Leadership Council. Once that is developed, in consultation with our ministry teams, the congregational survey summary and strategic plan draft will be shared with you, our congregation. The summary results for the pastor evaluation will be shared and reviewed by our Council. We will compare the congregation's input with the responses provided solely by the Council. We will then meet with Pastor John to review and plan for the coming months. This type of evaluation occurs annually as directed again by our by-laws.

Thank you again for your time and engagement in completing these surveys. Working together, discussing our issues, listening to each other, forgiving ourselves and other church members can only strengthen who we are. God bless you all.

Rooted in LOVE

Our Stewardship theme of "Rooted in Love" draws inspiration from Psalm 1, "They are like trees planted by streams of water, which yield their fruit in its season." The Psalmist invited us to imagine all the good things we can bear when well planted. What might we give away when rooted in love?

But the Psalmist also meant something deeper. The word we translate as "planted" in English means "transplanted" in Hebrew. This translation speaks to the power of love to move us from one place to another, the power to convert us from one way of life to another. What would need to change in our lives for us to be fully rooted in love?


We might need to make a move from a "mindset of scarcity" to a "mindset of abundance." A scarcity mindset makes us think there will never be enough - we must compete, one against another, because there is not enough to go around. Scarcity thinking names all the things we cannot do, all the things we cannot share. But a mindset of abundance sees the fullness of God's love. Martin Luther King Jr. saw the world abundantly - despite all the injustice he confronted, King knew God's spirit moved through history, creating and renewing community.

King once described the force of love that animated the Civil Rights Movement.

"Agape is not a weak, passive love. It is love in action. Agape is love seeking to preserve and create community. It is insistence on community even when one seeks to break it. Agape is a willingness to go to any length to restore broken community."

What would it mean for our lives to be rooted in such love?




