# BETHLEHEM CHURCH WILL HOST THE ROTATING SHELTER PROGRAM MARCH 14-20, 2022

#### WHAT IS THE MEN'S ROTATING SHELTER?

An annual program for the winter months to provide overnight hosting for men when the number needing housing exceeds the capacity of the Delonis Center. It is sponsored by the Shelter Association of Washtenaw County (SAWC).

## WHAT IS BETHLEHEM'S ROLE IN THE PROGRAM THIS YEAR?

Bethlehem Church will host approximately up to 25 men each night from March 14 to 20. Our participation is led by the Outreach Ministry Team, with the endorsement of the Leadership Council and other ministry teams. Mary Jean Raab, Sue Muir and Roy Muir are serving as co-chairs of the congregation's participation.

### WHAT IS OUR HISTORY IN PARTICIPATING IN THIS?

Bethlehem was a founding participant in hosting during the first year of the program in the 1980s, and continued as a host through 2017. We have committed to renew our participation for the present year

#### WHAT WILL BE THE RESPONSIBILITIES OF BETHLEHEM?

Men will be screened and registered at the Delonis Center each evening, and will arrive by van at approximately 7:30 pm. Lights out will be at 10 pm. They will be picked up by the Shelter van at 8 am the next morning.

## HOW MANY VOLUNTEERS WILL BE NEEDED, AND WHAT WILL THEIR ROLES BE?

We will seek to enlist at least 3 or 4 host volunteers who will serve to greet/welcome the men, stay overnight, provide information on where restrooms are and other questions.

## WHERE WILL THE GUESTS SLEEP AT THE CHURCH?

A location at Bethlehem will be determined in collaboration with the Facilities Ministry Team. In past years men have slept in the youth room or other locations. Sleeping cots are provided by the Delonis Center

#### WHAT OTHER CHURCHES ARE PARTICIPATING AS HOSTS?

Bethlehem is one of over a dozen Ann Arbor area congregations hosting for one or two weeks each. These include Zion Lutheran, First Presbyterian, First Baptist, St. Luke Lutheran, Christian Reformed, St. Mary, First Presbyterian Saline, St. Francis, Calvary United Methodist and St. Claire/Temple Beth. The program has drawn wide participation from community denominations and congregations.

### HOW CAN THOSE INTERESTED LEARN MORE AND REGISTER TO SERVE?
