# PEACE NEIGHBORHOOD CENTER DECEMBER 14, 2021

## WHAT IS BETHLEHEM'S ROLE IN THE PROGRAM THIS YEAR?

Bethlehem Church will host approximately up to 25 men each night from March 14 to 20. Our participation is led by the Outreach Ministry Team, with the endorsement of the Leadership Council and other ministry teams. Mary Jean Raab, Sue Muir and Roy Muir are serving as co-chairs of the congregation's participation.

## HOW MANY VOLUNTEERS WILL BE NEEDED, AND WHAT WILL THEIR ROLES BE?

We will seek to enlist at least 3 or 4 host volunteers who will serve to greet/welcome the men, stay overnight, provide information on where restrooms are and other questions.

## WHAT IS OUR HISTORY IN PARTICIPATING IN THIS?

Bethlehem was a founding participant in hosting during the first year of the program in the 1980s, and continued as a host through 2017. We have committed to renew our participation for the present year.
