Message from the PRESIDENT

Tying Up Loose Ends

Dear Bethlehem,

I am writing to update you regarding several activities that have been ongoing for the past several months. To begin, let me review the status of the congregational self-reflection survey submitted last October. The surveys were tabulated and summarized. All total, Council received 73 responses and I am very thankful to

all who took the time to provide this valuable feedback and reflection. The summary graphs were distributed to all of our ministry team leads, standing committee chairs, and Council. Two meetings were held to discuss the data and each chair/lead was asked to reflect on how the information provided can be used to plan for next year. Attached is the document for your review and reflection. Please note the document is 25 pages if you intend to print. Please click HERE to access an electronic version of the results or you may contact the church office to request a printed copy.

We are rapidly approaching the end of our church fiscal year. This means that our ministry teams are being asked for their recommendations regarding next year's operating budget. A very significant aspect of budget planning is the distribution and collection of our Stewardship pledge forms. If you have not already done so, please take a moment to complete and send back your Stewardship card. The proposed annual budget will be presented to the congregation for approval on Sunday, June 12th following our church service, please mark this date on your calendar.

On a different note, over the past 10 months we had several times when emergency messages needed to get out quickly to our congregation. Our current system does not provide adequate emergency messaging. I am currently working with Gwen and Pastor John to implement a program called Remind. This program is used in many school systems and churches to send out text messages to any registered cellphone. In the coming weeks, we will test the system and as part of this test, you will be provided an opportunity to opt in or out of this emergency notification system.

Finally, we are continuing to seek volunteers in almost every area of our church; office, worship, leadership, music, etc. Please consider dedicating some portion of your time to become engaged with the operations that are needed to keep Bethlehem moving forward.

You'll need an account on each website which includes your phone number or alternate ID.

For Busch's - on www.buschs.com log into your account and select Cash for Education under your name. Enroll in the 2022 Cash for Education by clicking the dropdown to select "Bethlehem United Church of Christ". Make sure to check the box "Add to Future Quarters" to make sure Bethlehem gets credit all year long. Enrollment is required each January for Bethlehem to continue to receive funds. When you shop at Busch's, use your phone number or alternate ID at the register.

For Kroger - on www.kroger.com log into your account and select My Account under your name then Community Rewards. Find Bethlehem United Church of Christ and click Enroll.

How to Watch BUCC Worship on YouTube



You can access our livestream/recorded

services on YouTube a few different ways. Please note that we start the live stream at 9:50am every Sunday morning to capture the prelude and announcements before the worship service begins.

Church Website: click on the "Watch" menu and you should see the live stream there every Sunday morning with a feed from our YouTube channel. There is also a link to our YouTube channel in order to access previous worship videos.

Smart TV: go to the "apps" on your smart TV at home to find the YouTube app. Open that and search for Bethlehem United Church of Christ Ann Arbor. When you find it, be sure to subscribe so it will be easy to find the next time. You can also hold the microphone button on your remote control and say "Open YouTube Bethlehem United Church of Christ Ann Arbor" and the search function should take you to our main YouTube page. From there, you can find the most recent videos and join a service that is in progress.

ANNOUNCING THE 2022 YOUTH LENTEN MISSION PROJECT "ANN ARBOR PUBLIC SCHOOLS SUPPORTS STUDENTS FUND"



The ANN ARBOR PUBLIC SCHOOLS SUPPORTS STUDENTS fund was chosen by the Education Ministry Team (EMT) and Youth and Young Adults Ministry Team (YYA), as this year's focus of the 2022 Youth Lenten Mission Project. This fund provides vital support for the needlest students.

AAPSSS has devised simple ways the community can support these students who lack the minimum standards to learn and grow. Donations to the fund can provide students with basic daily necessities, as well as supporting teacher and social worker purchases districtwide for much needed supplies.

In making this decision, the youth and ministry teams were inspired to take action by the following truths:



Over 25% of the students at Ann Arbor Public Schools face poverty on a yearly basis.





The Covid-19 pandemic has significantly added additional costs and needs for these students and families

Many students lack basic necessities including food & clothing



AAPSSS is asking for gift card donations in \$25, \$50, or \$100 denominations from Meijer, Kroger, Target or Walmart. The gift cards collected will be given to the AAPSSS Fund where social workers determine the distribution for the students with the most need.



Our goal is to raise \$2,000 for this fund over the course of the Lenten season. Beginning on Ash Wednesday, March 2nd, though Easter, we are asking our Bethlehem congregation to contribute to this campaign.

A collection box will in the office during the week. A collection box will also be in the Sanctuary at Sunday services to collect donations of money or gift cards. In addition, there will be a line item on the online giving site. Monetary donations will be used to purchase gift cards.

As always, Education and Youth and Young Adult ministry teams appreciate the generosity and support of the Bethlehem community. Thank-you!

OUTREACH MINISTRY TEAM



On Sunday, February 27, Scott Roubeck from the Community Kitchen at the Delonis Center was highlighted during our Outreach Moment. Scott has been with Food Gatherers since 2008 as one of the Community Kitchen Managers. He thanked our congregation for its many years of support both financially and by volunteering. Scott has worked with Jamie Dylenski, Alice Dechert, and Ron Dechert (all pictured above) on the 1st Sunday of every month for over 15 years!

Scott shared with us how the mission of the Community Kitchen changed drastically with Covid. Food needs jumped from 6-7 million pounds of food per year to 9-10 million pounds. With only 24 persons at a time being able to eat in the Delonis dining room, hundreds of meals a day needed to be prepared for take-out, all of which required disposable containers. 35-40 volunteers per day dropped to 9 per day to help with the meal preparations and distributions, which resulted in their workloads being quadrupled.

Scott shared that thanks to Food Gatherers and many community groups and organizations giving incredible support, the Community Kitchen was able to continue serving our community.

We are so grateful for Scott, who offers comfort, stability, and hope to hungry clients, one nutritious and delicious plate at a time.

And thank you to Jamie, Alice and Ron and others in our congregation for your faithful volunteering at the Community Kitchen!



We heard from Scott Roubeck on February 27 how important any food contributions to Food Gatherers enables the Community Kitchen to provide hundreds of meals per day to our community. The need has never been greater.

We have a FOOD BARREL located in our building where contributions can be dropped off at any time the building is open. Items most in need are soup, canned meat or vegetables, pasta, beans, rice, cereal, granola bars, peanut butter, jelly, baby food, formula, diapers, and toiletries. PLEASE NO GLASS CONTAINERS.

We urge and challenge our congregation to be able to fill the Food Barrel completely up ever month!



Thank you to Sue Wortman, Kelly Williams, Jim Rowan, and Katie Rowan for sorting and stocking many, many pounds of food at Food Gatherers Warehouse on February 19 from 9:30-11:30 am.
