# Ponderíngs on Forgíveness to start the new year - Happy 2023...

Every family has their stories and my family is no different. I never knew my great aunt, my grandmother's sister, for a very simple reason. My grandmother and her sister never spoke to one another, at least not from the time I was born. They did nothing together for 30 years. As the story goes, they no longer knew why they were angry or what caused the breakup, but they went to their graves without speaking.

Somewhere in this story I took away a lesson on the importance of forgiveness or a lesson on the temperament of the German women in my family and a caution for my life. In Matthew 18: 21-22, we read these words: "Then Peter came and said to him, 'Lord, if another member of the church sins against me, how often should I forgive? As many as seven times?' Jesus said to him, 'Not seven times, but, I tell you, seventy-seven times.'" This is how to love your neighbor.

What happened that caused these ladies to be so unforgiving? Maybe another way to look at it is, what did one or both of these ladies do that prevented them from receiving the support, love and care from each other for the rest of their lives? As we learn from the parable of the unforgiving servant in Matthew 18:23-35, there is punishment for being an unforgiving soul. My grandmother and great aunt punished themselves by not forgiving and holding a grudge - what a waste of a lifetime.

Forgiveness is some times hard to give, but living a life of bitterness without charity and forgiveness can be far more difficult. We all have something in common, we are all part of the human race and as such, we are going to mess up on a regular basis. Why are we so surprised when it happens? Let us praise God and thank the Lord for showing us how to forgive. Let us practice forgiveness...not only of others, but of ourselves too. If our Lord Jesus was willing to die for the forgiveness of our sins, we can all find the words to forgive each other our humanness. As a recent Face Book quote stated, "Forgiving will never change the past, but it just may change your future." (anonymous) Who deserves your forgiveness today?

It's been a few months since the last Bethlehem Cemetery Board article was written for the Visitor and it is time to share a brief history of the cemetery and to share the change in the Board's responsibilities. One acre of land was deeded to Bethlehem Church in 1833 by Daniel Allmendinger for the first church and for a cemetery. The first burial took place in 1834 and Bethlehem Church became responsible for maintaining the accurate records of the purchase of grave sites, the location of the burial sites in the cemetery and responsibility for maintaining the grounds. The cemetery became an entity of the church. When the church moved into downtown Ann Arbor the cemetery was opened to the public. The record keeping responsibilities increased for the church office staff. At some point the Bethlehem Cemetery Board was formed to make decisions in regards to maintaining the cemetery. The church office staff and volunteers continued to be responsible for the record keeping and eventually a Sexton was hired to manage the cemetery. This past May, the Cemetery Board learned that the church office staff was no longer responsible for the cemetery record keeping. It meant working with the Leadership Council to allow the cemetery records, phone calls and computer access to remain in the secured church office space. The Cemetery Board hired Betty Clark to continue as the bookkeeper, and John and Karen Samford to continue to maintain the cemetery records. As co-presidents of the Board, Sue Buday and Mary Friend are learning the daily operations of the cemetery. It includes maintaining the accuracy of the paperwork before it is given to Betty and the Samfords for processing, responding to emails, phone call inquiries about the cemetery, and researching questions for family members. Jim Lutz continues to be the treasurer, Sallie Stadel is the secretary, Mary Jean Raab and Jamie Dylenski are new to the Board and Marilyn Pearson is our member at large. Brad Bouchie is the Sexton. The Cemetery Board has managed to maintain the sales and burial rates for a few years, however, In November, the board voted to increase our prices. The Board is including the new rates in this Visitor. The Cemetery Board thanks Susan Irwin for her dedication to the Bethlehem Cemetery Board.
