Dear Beloved Members, Elected officers, Friends, and Staff of Bethlehem UCC,

After much prayer and discernment, I have chosen to submit my letter of resignation as the Pastor/Head of Staff of Bethlehem UCC. This February 8th, Karen and I would have begun our 9th year in ministry with Bethlehem. During these past 3 months away on medical leave (while utilizing earned sabbatical time), I had the opportunity to reflect and discuss with Karen, my family, and my mentors about where God is leading me next. I believe the answer is, God is leading my family and I to a new ministry setting where my gifts are most helpful.

I know God will continue to guide Bethlehem as you discern afresh where God is leading you in all ways, including discovering the kind of leadership that will be most faithful and effective while Bethlehem continues its 190-year journey in mission and ministry. I am thankful the Leadership Council has graciously granted my family and I the next few months to focus my time and energy on seeking my next calling as a parish pastor. In order to focus on this process, my role as your pastor will officially end effective on January 14th. It is proper for an outgoing pastor to limit communications so that the Church and its Leadership can focus on all that is necessary during this transition. I send my best wishes and blessings to your President, Ron Dechert and the elected leadership during this time of discernment and transition.

My family and I will continue to celebrate and cherish the wonderful relationships and memories that we have shared with so many of you these past 8-years. I thank you for the privilege I have had to serve as your pastor and please know we love you all with no take-backs!

I know the Leadership Council is arranging a time for us to celebrate our years together in mission, ministry, and fellowship with a Service of Farewell. I look forward to saying goodbye to as many of you as possible during that time. Rev. Dr. Lillian Daniel, our new Michigan Conference Minister will be present to lead the Service of Farewell in solidarity with your Associate Pastor, Rev. Diane White.

Thank you again for the privilege of serving with you in mission and ministry!
