Dear Friends in Christ,

Many of you are aware that I have held positions in public education, banking, healthcare, and transportation. I have always loved taking on a new position because there was always a new challenge in the learning. Each industry has its own language, culture and mode of operation.

This is also true in churches. Bethlehem UCC in Ann Arbor does things differently than Clinton UCC in Clinton and St. Paul UCC in Saline. There are different ways to begin the service, light the candles, ring the bells, serve communion, meet as a governing body, communicate and serve. Each church knows what needs to be done when and how to do it without giving it much thought because it's "the way we've always done it."

I wonder if this is the "well-adjusted in the culture" that Paul is warning the church in Rome about? Do we get so comfortable doing what we do that we forget why we do it? Do we keep adding more and more and more without ever stopping to ask who God wants us to be and what God wants us to do? We have God's instruction manual to help us develop well-formed maturity. Our prayer life and understanding of God's Word help us draw closer to spiritual maturity in our relationship with God and spiritual maturity with each other. Let us all spend this time during lent and this time of transition praying and asking for God's input as we move forward as the church of Jesus Christ who is the creator of the Way.
