Beloved ones,

Do you find comfort in Jesus' words? I hope so. But I'm guessing that some of you may be reading his last sentence and thinking – "Today's

trouble?! I'm (we're) drowning here! When will the chaos ever end??!" Truly, some of life's seasons can be VERY hard, especially when we find ourselves in a transitional season – unable to turn back, uncertain about what the future holds, unable to see through the 'fog' of today, and maybe feeling lost in a wilderness experience with seemingly no way out. Don't worry, Jesus? Sorry, we're human. Worry goes with the territory. My friends, whatever you're feeling right now, (sorrow, fear, anger, hopelessness, etc.) it's where you are and that's okay. Hold on. We'll get through this, TOGETHER.

You know, in the short eleven days that I've been with you, I have felt your anxiety, your worry, your pain, and your grief. And I know that I have so very much yet to learn about you – so much yet to triage. Yes, over the next several months, I will be in triage-mode, assessing this Body of Christ, person by person and team by team. I will render first aid when and where it is needed, all with the goal of stabilizing you. Short-term and long-term treatment plans will be developed, implemented and adjusted as we move along, to promote your healing and strength. And as Jesus said, don't worry. While you may feel awful, Bethlehem UCC does not have a life-threatening condition. You will recover and flourish once again, likely in new and amazing ways!

And that is not my opinion alone. Even our Conference Minister, Lillian Daniel, believes that. When she and I spoke earlier this week about Conference and Association matters, we also spoke about you and the great future ahead of you. 190 years and counting! Rev. Daniel sends you her love and prayers.

Be of good cheer! Have hope in the Lord who loves you, and who calls you to ministry. I know, for some of you, you're hanging on to hope by your fingernails. Honestly, sometimes hope is a leap of faith, trusting in the One who created us, who loves us unconditionally, and who walks with us through all of the ups and downs of life. One of the most beautiful expressions of hope that I have ever read was inscribed on a cellar wall in Cologne Germany, during WWII. It was written by Jews in hiding. Their beautiful words were captured many decades later in a choral piece called Inscription of Hope. I'm sharing those words with you, praying that the Spirit will carry them deep into your hearts and give you hope akin to those who originally inscribed them. *(Continued on page 2)*

Messade from the PRESIDENT

Council Updates- August 2023

Dear Bethlehem Members and Friends,

Recently Pastor Dawn commented to me that there are many moving parts here at Bethlehem, this is a very honest and correct statement. Bethlehem has historically been blessed with committed members who volunteered for elected and non-elected roles. Our current governance structure relies significantly on the involvement of our members. It is through this laity-led structure that most of the church business is done. It is true that we have seen significant reductions in the number of volunteers, year-over-year, who support the work of this congregation. There is always room and need for more volunteers. We currently do not have chairs for Outreach, Fellowship, Worship, and Nominations. In addition, we do not have a Council Secretary, although Council continues to discuss this position with members who might be interested. Nonetheless,

the many activities of Bethlehem continue. If you could help as a volunteer, please contact any member of Council or myself (rdechert@umich.edu), we would be happy to direct you to the right contact person. We need volunteers not only for our ministry teams, but also for recurring functions like; liturgist, usher, office support, live streaming, to name a few.

I am writing today to update our members and friends on specific topics that came up during our annual meeting in June. The status of the Hewett St parsonage was one topic. Our members directed Council to gather additional information regarding the possible options (rent or sell). A follow-up congregational meeting was held July 9th to allow the congregation to vote on these options. The congregation voted to retain the parsonage and to partner with Reinhart Reality to get the house ready to rent in September. The timeline is very tight so we must move as quickly as possible to address all of the items identified by both Reinhart and the Ann Arbor City inspector. We hope to have the house ready and rented in September.

At the annual meeting we also heard from Facilities about a new State law that would impact our elevator and our operating budget. The new law requires a special safety breaking system to be installed on all elevators. The estimated cost for that retrofitting of our elevator was reported as \$30,000. The deadline identified in the original communication was June 2024. Effort was made to seek deferment or waiver for this given the significant cost without any response from the state. We have also tried to identify grant sources which may cover this expense without success to date. Earlier this week, we received communication from our elevator repair company that the State of Michigan postponed the deadline until 2027. We are happy with this decision but we will need to budget for it a few years from now.

Finally, at the start of this month our new interim pastor (Rev. Dawn Christenson) began her leadership here at Bethlehem. Reverend Dawn brings tremendous energy to her new (for us) position. She has been making efforts to meet as many members and to attend as many ministry team meetings as possible. At present, Rev. Dawn will be keeping office hours on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday. Should you or someone you know need spiritual support from Rev. Dawn, please contact the church office. She can also be reached through text messaging. The church office can provide you with the contact information.

God Bless You All, for all you do and bring to Bethlehem.

OUTREACH NEWS

Outreach Ministry Team - Bethlehem United Church of Christ

As the 2022-23 Fiscal Year for Bethlehem comes to a close, we want to thank everyone who supported the Outreach Ministry Team's efforts this year with both monetary contributions and volunteering.

Here is a recap of some of the highlights of the activities of this year's OMT efforts:

- Habitat for Humanity Huron Valley: \$1,336
- Participated in CROP Walk 2022 and raised \$3,695
- From Bethlehem's Operating Budget dispersed to Peace Neighborhood Center, Alpha House & Food Gatherers: \$4,000 each
- Education Ministry Team (with support from OMT) for the SCS Lenten Project - AAPS Support Students Fund: \$3,925
- Provided meals for Alpha House on a Sunday in August (2022) and January (2023) Our next time to provide a meal is in May.
- Meals prepared the first Sunday of every month at the Community Kitchen thanks to Ron & Alice Dechert, Jamie Dylenski, Tom Ziesemer, Marty & Laura Seyfried for volunteering.
- Volunteers helped weekly on Fridays at Peace Neighborhood Center with food distributions (special thanks to Katie Rowan, Kathy Warner, Dave Gilmore, Sue Muir for volunteering weekly).
- Volunteers helped at Food Gatherers Warehouse on a Saturday in June (2022)
- The war in Ukraine prompted our team to establish an appeal to raise monies for Ukrainian refugees. Women of Bethlehem presented a check for \$5,000 for this endeavor and a challenge for the congregation to match their gift. To date, a total of \$11,105 has been raised!



On Saturday, May 20, a group of volunteers from Bethlehem (Larisa Jaskiewicz, Jamie Raab, Ellie Vasquez, Jennifer Vasquez, Edgar Vasquez, and Diane White)) worked with additional volunteers from Knox Presbyterian on a Habitat for Humanity of Huron Valley build at 1093 Desoto Ave in Ypsilanti. Tasks that day included installing a window, pulling nails, and building a shed. Katie Rowan stopped by with a delicious and nourishing lunch, which was much appreciated fuel for the second half of the day! Over the past several weeks, we had been collecting money from the congregation to personally deliver to Habitat at our build date. Most of this money came from free will offerings at two mini bake sales that we hosted during coffee hour. We were able to hand a check to Habitat for \$959. Plus, according to Habitat, each volunteer saves them about \$25/hour. Thank you as always, Bethlehem members, for your generosity!
