"BUCC November Newsletter – From Pastor Dawn

"Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted." (Matthew 5:4)



Beloved ones, as I write this, I realize that we have been together a little over 3 months. I am slowly getting acquainted with many of you. And I must say that you are rapidly finding a very special place in my heart.

Over the past few months, I am frequently asked: "Are we going to make it?" "Can we survive?" To such questions I must respond with a resounding "YES!" Frankly, I would not have come here if I didn't believe that to be true. Have I seen the financials? Yes. Have I seen the attendance figures, compared to years-gone-by? Yes. AND I've seen a deep, rich 190-year history, and a core of current, faithful, committed disciples. I believe. My quest is to help you believe in yourselves, as I believe in you.

All that said, I have been struggling to understand what appeared to me to be a lack of engagement and apathy. Such behaviors don't just happen out of the blue, for individuals or a community. So, I put on my 'diagnostic hat', seeking causes for such effects. The Lombard report pointed to some answers – key traumatic events and challenges over the past 25 years. The Lombard team did an excellent job of capturing these, not the least of which included the retirement (and now death) of the beloved Rev. Orval Willimann and the sudden death of Rev. Greg Smith. Conflicts with subsequent pastors and within the congregation have added layer upon layer of more grief and pain. Grief accompanies every loss – not just those involving the death of someone we love. We also grieve the loss of relationships, good health, ability, independence, and so much more. The grief of each loss is like a giant snowball rolling downhill, increasing to an enormous size by the time it reaches the valley below. You are in that valley. And in conversation with many of you, I have come to understand how heavy the cumulative weight of the grief and pain weigh on you. Honestly, my heart aches for you.

So, what do we do from here? We lean on God's everlasting arms and begin the healing process. It is the only way to dig out from under the weight of that giant, painful, chilling snowball. This is necessary, before we begin our journey back to the peaceful mountaintop, where the air is crisp and clear, the sunshine warm, and the view exquisite. With the help of God, we will make it to the summit. I have every confidence that we will! Dear ones, this is not the first time Bethlehem UCC has found itself in a snow-filled valley. Over the past 190 years, Bethlehem has dug itself out, mended what was broken by countless snowballs, and rose again to the mountaintop. Let's follow the historic precedent and mend your broken hearts first, before pressing upward.

"Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted." Pastor Diane and I are committed to walking with you through the valley of your grief and helping you heal. We are here for you, as individuals and as a community of faith. As we consider your grief and pain, we know that the upcoming holidays may be difficult. Each of you will respond in different ways, to the festivities of the holiday season. The holiday season is a time that may be joyous for some and agonizing for others.

WOMEN OF BETHLEHEM



For 190 years, women of Bethlehem have had a integral part in many aspects of our congregational life. But in particular, the benevolent work of the women has been recorded in many forms of service since the organization of the Frauenverein in 1871. Those services included mission projects, relief calls, assistance to local service agencies, scholarships, and acts of love to shut-ins and the aged.

In 1917, the Bethlehem Auxiliary was formed. Since that time, several women's circles have come and gone. But the Auxiliary Circle

still remains, and it currently is combined with the Mother's Study Circle, which was formed in the early 1950s. These two circles, in particular, have been very involved in benevolent work for Church World Service, which includes Blanket Sunday, Health Kits, Baby Kits, and School Kits. Auxiliary/Mothers Study, with about 10 members remaining, were meeting regularly until Covid.

Recently, the Auxiliary Circle/Mother's Study donated \$250 for CWS
Period Packs that were assembled at this year's CROP Walk on October
15. The Ann Arbor CROP Walk Committee is very grateful for their
support of this project for women in need. Thank you for your legacy
of support for Church World Service!

Have you noticed how God always has a plan for us even when we are so troubled, we're not sure which way is up? Jeremiah 29:11 tells us, "For I know the plans I have for you," declares the LORD, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future."
