For now, I am happy to share our preliminary information with you.

First, we established a Covenantal Agreement for our work together:

- V = VALUE one another and our VARIED perspectives
- E = EMPATHETICALLY and generously listen, and carefully EXAMINE our own assumptions, presuppositions & perspectives
 - N = NOTE opportunities for finding common ground
 - A = embrace AMBIGUITY, rather than debate who is right or wrong
 - **N = NEGOTIATE** cooperatively and collaboratively for the greater good
 - T = TRUST the Holy Spirit to guide us

We also developed a purpose statement, goals and objectives, as follows:

PURPOSE

The purpose of this process is to review the current bylaws and to propose revisions to facilitate greater Ministry Team flexibility, improve efficiency, communication and collaboration, and optimize the number of elected leaders in keeping with available volunteers.

GOALS

Work as a team, adhering to the OUR COVENANT Agreement throughout the process.

Provide careful, phased review of the current bylaws.

Draft recommendations for changes to the Bylaws.

At each phase, submit drafts of potential revisions to elected leaders. On input from elected leaders, share draft ideas to the congregation for input.

Estimated completion of review process by early to mid May, 2024.

OBJECTIVES & PROCEDURES

Bylaws Review process:

Review in phases

Phase I – Articles I through V - target March 21 completion

Phase II – Article VI

Phase III - Article VII

Phase IV - Articles VIII & IX

Phase V - Articles X through XIV

Review for thoroughness, clarity, accuracy and consistency.

Review for useability and functionality, given the current context, as well as flexibility for the future.

Review for omissions and gaps.

Review to ensure that all facets of the Bylaws are in keeping with United Church of Christ polity and doctrine, and that they are representative of the heritage and Open and Affirming standing of Bethlehem United Church of Christ.

C. Recommendations for changes to the Bylaws:

As items in need of change are identified, the following format for proposed changes shall be followed:

Cite the Article, Section, Heading/Subheading of the item needing the change.

Cite the line number(s) being considered for change.

Document & show the original text.

Below the original text, document and show the proposed change(s).

Consider using a different colored text, to contrast the actual change from the original.

Provide rationale for the proposed change(s).

Date each draft.

D. Reporting & seeking input from elected leaders and the congregation:

Provide progress updates to elected leaders and the congregation on a regular basis, minimally once per month.

Solicit input of drafted changes,

Following the phased process;

Following the format cited in section C, above;

Providing sufficient notice (10-14 days) of impending availability of proposal for review;

Setting a deadline for receipt of input;

Receive input through various means, including but not limited to: verbal, written and electronic communication Input may be given to any member of the Bylaws Committee

Anyone giving input in written or electronic forms, must provide their name and contact information, to allow for follow-up clarification inquiries.

Actions in response to received input:

a.) If wholly affirmative:

So note with date of affirmation on the proposal.

Inform elected leaders and congregation of affirmative outcome.

Move on to next item/phase of review process.

b.) If suggestions and/or requests for clarification received:

Inform elected leaders and congregation that further work is needed for the given item.

Reassess proposed draft

Discern if/how suggestions might be integrated.

Discern how both the drafted change(s) and rationale might be clarified.

Revise proposal

Provide a newly drafted proposal for review, per section D.2. of this document.

E. Completion of Project

Estimated by early to mid May

Inform elected leaders and congregation that the project has been completed.

Prepare a final, complete copy of the proposed bylaws changes with rationale to the Leadership Council and congregation, if possible, no later than June 2, 2024, in preparation for the Annual Meeting.

If further work is to be completed beyond the Annual Meeting, those drafted changes affirmed by the Leadership Council and congregation are to be placed before the Governing Body at the Annual Meeting.

Work to be completed beyond the Annual Meeting shall be done per Sections B and C of this document. If necessary, Leadership Council may call a special congregational meeting to address final proposed changes.

Greetings from Bethlehem Cemetery

First, we would like to thank our many donors, for their gifts to the maintenance and preservation of our cemetery. It takes a lot of work, money, and diligence to maintain this large and historic site. We welcome donations at any time, especially now, as Mother's Day is approaching. When you want to donate to Bethlehem Cemetery, just indicate that on the memo line, when writing your check to BUCC. Thank you.

Bethlehem Cemetery Expense Budget:

Starting this month and continuing in future months, our Visitor article will cover various cost aspects of the cemetery operations. This month we are focusing on the costs of utilities, mostly fixed expenses.

Last calendar year, the cost of the Water Bill paid to the City of Ann Arbor, was \$6722. The interesting part is we do not get water from the City of Ann Arbor, we have our well.

This entire bill is for **STORMWATER DISCHARGE.** The DTE bill for electricity was \$2134 and the vast majority of this was for the safety lighting provided on the tall wood poles. Waste removal, dumpster, \$1211. The cost of gas to heat the small building was \$866.

Most importantly, thank you to all Bethlehem members and friends for their interest and help in making Bethlehem Cemetery the peaceful and tranquil property it is, amid the busy City of Ann Arbor. If you have not visited in a long time, please drive through someday when traveling on Jackson Road.

- Wear comfortable clothes that can get dirty and dress for the weather. We do not guarantee heat/air condition at any of our work sites
- Wear closed-toed shoes or work boots (no open-toed shoes)
- Remove jewelry and pull back loose hair
- We have disposable water bottles on site, but do not offer food. Plan to go out or bring lunch (we'll break for an hour at noon, but do not provide food)
- Port-a-jons will be available
- Tools & equipment will be provided. You are welcome to bring your own, but you are responsible for them, and they are subject to our House Leader's safety check
- Safety is our highest priority! Keeping a safe worksite is everyone's responsibility. All PPE will be provided, but you can bring your own (eye protection, work gloves, mask, etc)
- Projects: Expected tasks will be emailed to you the week of your build day. Please dress accordingly
- Age Restrictions: Due to safety regulations, individuals under the age of 16 are not permitted on our active sites.
 Those ages 16 - 17 must have a waiver completed by a parent/guardian and be accompanied by an adult while on site

All volunteers must register online by the Monday before each scheduled build day.

Expected tasks, additional details and possible location changes will be emailed the week of each scheduled build day.

All MUST arrive by 9 AM and plan to stay on site until the projects have been completed.

This will also allow us to bring the audio of non-Sunday worship services to you such as the Longest Night Service, Christmas Eve service, Good Friday services, etc. With this phone service, you will be able to hear the worship service wherever you are.
