# From the Pastor

# **Giving Thanks**

It is good to give thanks to the Lord, to sing praises to your name, O Most High; to declare your steadfast love in the morning, and your faithfulness by night...For you, O Lord, have made me glad by your work; at the work of your hands I sing for joy. (Psalm 92:1-2 & 4)

Beloved Ones, we have much to be thankful for! Here are just a few of the things that I am grateful for...

I give thanks for being blessed to be part of Bethlehem United Church of Christ! This is such a blessed community that I have grown to love. Yes, there are fewer of you now than 5 years ago. Yet, those of you who remain are strong, resilient, and faithful. It is YOU, with the help of God, who have carried Bethlehem through difficult times. It is YOU, with the help of God, who will transform Bethlehem into a new version of herself for future generations. YOU are Bethlehem UCC, and I am so grateful for you!

We spoke of such things during our conversation about the Lombard report on October 13<sup>th</sup>. I am very grateful to those of you who attended that meeting. And while the pain and grief was still evident, I witnessed a transformed community; a community who cares deeply about BUCC and her people; a community who have a vision for the future of Bethlehem UCC. I am deeply grateful to all of you who shared your hearts and hopes for the future. From our conversation that day, we gleaned things that are needed for the well-being of Bethlehem and her future, including discerning the pastor's role and the congregation's expectations of the pastor(s); discerning leadership's role; discerning the congregation's (governing body) role; as well as the need for a well-defined and developed Pastoral Relations Committee. Some of these things are being addressed through the work of the ad hoc Bylaws Committee. (More on that coming soon.) Some will be discerned and developed through our interim work together.

I am grateful to everyone who desires and is working toward improved 2-way communication and transparency. Living into that, as individuals, collectively contributes to the whole. If we each say to ourselves, "If it is to be, it's up to me." We can and will create the communication that we desire. And many of you realize that living in community, a Christian community, we must foster relationships and communication embodied by acceptance, love, and support, without judgment. You know the importance of finding common ground, and celebrating all of the positives and each milestone achieved. You have already achieved a tremendous milestone by turning your sights to the future rather than looking back. I thank God for you! I thank God for your honesty, for sharing your hopes and fears, and for sharing your dreams and your creativity to achieve those dreams.

Good people of Bethlehem, give thanks that you are rising like a Phoenix from the ashes, like Christ from the grave. Give thanks to our ever-faithful and loving God for leading you to this moment in time – a time when you


