Blessings,

"Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus the pioneer and perfecter of our faith." (Hebrews 12:1-2a)

Beloved Ones, the race before us is not a sprint, it's more like a relayed-marathon, requiring slow & steady effort from all of us. All of the forebearers of Bethlehem have run this race, passing the baton to each subsequent generation of members across our 191-year history. Tag, we're it. And on our journey carrying that baton together, we can see a milestone in the race looming larger – the calling of Bethlehem's next settled pastor. Before we reach that milestone, we've got a few legs in the race to be completed first.

First, we need to complete our revisions to the Bylaws. The work of the Bylaws Committee has been reviewed by the Leadership Council, and their recommendations for clarification have been submitted to the Committee. Very soon, the recommended revisions will be shared with the congregation. How those recommendations are shared with you will be different that the Committee originally planned. After sharing Phase I revisions, we realized that revisions to the remaining sections of the Bylaws could not be completed as planned. They are all far too interconnected and interdependent to be reviewed and shared as originally outlined. We are still discerning the best way to share the recommended revisions. Very likely, we will be sharing the full document with recommended revisions and rationale, plus the original Bylaws document for comparison. That will be a great deal to digest. So, to help everyone in the congregation, the Bylaws Committee is also tentatively planning to offer presentations and conversations, to answer questions and receive feedback. Based on feedback, final revisions will be made. We hope to present the revised Bylaws for congregational vote at the Annual Meeting in June.

Second, we need to complete information gathering, through all of the workshops. As of this writing (2/15/25), we have three workshops yet to go. The information gathered from all of them will be used by the Search Committee to generate a new Church Profile (our resume', if you will). That Profile is key for attracting optimal clergy candidates for consideration. So, your participation in the remaining workshops is essential for gathering accurate and comprehensive information.

Third, once the Search Committee is formed (soon and very soon), approved and commissioned, they will complete Bethlehem's profile. Once that profile is validated by the Michigan Conference, it will be shared through the UCC National setting. Clergy profiles of interested candidates will be sent to the Search Committee for review. They will review, interview, and assess all candidates carefully and thoroughly. Their Spirit-led discernment process will culminate in determining the best candidate to be brought before the congregation for consideration, during a *Candidating Weekend*. During that weekend, you'll be able to meet and greet the candidate. On that Sunday, the candidate will lead and preach in worship. Following worship, a special congregational meeting will be held to vote on whether or not to call the candidate to be the next Settled Pastor. If called, generally 2-3 months later, your new pastor will begin ministry with you.

The question has been asked recently — "What about you, Pastor Dawn? How long will you be with us?" The answer to that is: I will be with you for as long as it takes. I don't have a crystal ball, but I believe it is quite possible for you to receive your new pastor by this fall or by the end of the year. How exciting is that?!

So, let's keep running the race set before us! Together, with the help of God, we'll reach our milestone. Thanks be to God. Amen.

"The United Church of Christ is calling you (that's you and me) to join a one-day initiative next month, to "March Forth on March 4th" with simple acts of justice work. 22 As we March Forth, as one church, in a one-day effort, we hope that together we can raise awareness of justice issues around the world with simple acts of advocacy, said the Rev. M. Linda Jaramillo, executive minister of UCC Justice and Witness Ministries. 'We are called to see the big picture in which people are struggling to live with dignity. Our faith challenges us to understand our lives are interconnected with theirs.'"

This is as much needed today as it was a few years ago and centuries ago and millennia ago...

The prophet Micah tells us, "He [God] has showed you, O mortal, what is good. And what does the LORD require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?" (6:8) NRSV

We have an opportunity to make a difference with a March Forth effort still today and maybe even more importantly today given all that is happening in our country and around the world. The March Forth, one-day initiative challenges each of us to look around us, find something we can do to stand up for justice and then do it. It's one day – your way. You choose how to advocate to improve the lives of people in your community, the nation or the world. Throw yourself into a project you are already passionate about: commit to buying fair trade products for your home or congregation; cut back on your electrical use; write letters to your representatives and president calling for compassionate immigration reform (or another justice issue); recycle; commit to prayer and study on justice issues in your community.

I am committing to March Forth for justice by writing more and more letters to my legislature representatives as well as the president to make my voice heard for justice. I would like to challenge each of you to March Forth as well in whatever way you are able.

It's ONE DAY ... YOUR WAY! How will you March Forth on March 4?

May the 4th be with you!


