"We are the Cho family. We immigrated to the United States from South Korea a few years ago in search of a better life and a future for our children. When we first came here, everything seemed unfamiliar and difficult: the language was unfamiliar, the culture was very different, and finding a stable home was not easy.

Housing instability was more than just a problem of moving frequently; it was a huge burden that affected our

Through it all, my family and I have leaned on each other to get through each day. My parents have worked tirelessly to make ends meet, and we've tried to adapt to our new surroundings. That's when I learned about Habitat for Humanity of Huron Valley, and I mustered up the courage to apply. In fact, when we applied, we weren't expecting to be accepted, we were just desperate to give it a try.

Since becoming involved with Habitat, we've realized that just having a stable place to live can lighten the weight of life a little bit. Life is still hectic and busy, but we don't have the same anxiety of not knowing when we'll have to move. We're able to focus more on what we need to do, and my parents are trying to focus on their jobs and not worry about housing. Things aren't completely better, but we definitely feel like we have a foundation to move forward from.

This experience has shown us firsthand that we didn't just get a home, we got a life-changing experience with someone's help, and we hope that one day we can give back as much, if not more, than we received. Thank you to everyone who listened to our family's story and stuck with us.


