To my dear church family,


Bear one another's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ. - Galatians 6:2 (NRSV)

Happy 192nd Birthday to Bethlehem Cemetery August, 2025 Beginning in 1833, church members and their friends buried their loved ones in the church yard outside the log cabin church sanctuary on Jackson Ave. As time passed, the burial grounds expanded, the church moved to town, services were no longer held at the cemetery site, and people of different faiths were welcomed. From time to time more land was purchased, and according to the survey and title search we completed in 2024, the cemetery now encompasses 24.5 acres. The first Burial Right Certificate, Deed #1 was issued to Adam Wahland and David Stoll in Block 1 in 1887. Today our newest recorded Burial Right Certificate is Deed #4150. As we look to the future, your Cemetery Board strives to keep our Bethlehem Cemetery the attractive, quiet, and peaceful place that it is today.

WHAT TO KNOW & HOW TO PREPARE

- · No construction experience necessary! Our House Leaders will ensure a variety of tasks are available for all individuals with a wide variety of skill levels and physical abilities.
- Wear comfortable clothes that can get dirty and dress for the weather. We do not guarantee heat/air condition at any of our work sites
- Wear closed-toed shoes or work boots (no open-toed shoes)
- Remove jewelry and pull back loose hair
- We have disposable water bottles on site, but do not offer food. Plan to go out or bring lunch (we'll break for an hour at noon but do not provide food)
- Port-a-ions will be available
- Tools & equipment will be provided. You are welcome to bring your own, but you are responsible for them, and they are subject to our House Leader's safety check
- Safety is our highest priority! Keeping a safe worksite is everyone's responsibility. All PPE will be provided, but you can bring your own (eve protection, work gloves, mask, etc)
- Projects: Expected tasks will be emailed to you the week of your build day. Please dress accordingly
- Age Restrictions: Due to safety regulations, individuals under the age of 16 are not permitted on our active sites. Those ages 16 - 17 must have a waiver completed by a parent/guardian and be accompanied by an adult while on site

SIGN UP TO VOLUNTEER

All volunteers must register online by the Monday prior to their chosen date.

Location details, expected tasks, and additional details and will be emailed to all volunteers the week of each scheduled build day.

All MUST arrive by 9 AM and plan to stay until 4 PM, unless projects/tasks are completed earlier.

How to Watch BUCC Worship on YouTube

You can access our livestream/recorded services on YouTube a few different ways. Please note that we start the live stream at 9:50am every Sunday morning to capture the prelude and announcements before the worship service begins.

<u>Church Website</u>: click on the "Watch" menu and you should see the live stream there every Sunday morning with a feed from our YouTube channel. There is also a link to our YouTube channel in order to access previous worship videos.

Smart TV: go to the "apps" on your smart TV at home to find the YouTube app. Open that and search for Bethlehem United Church of Christ Ann Arbor. When you find it, be sure to subscribe so it will be easy to find the next time. You can also hold the microphone button on your remote control and say "Open YouTube Bethlehem United Church of Christ Ann Arbor" and the search function should take you to our main YouTube page. From there, you can find the most recent videos and join a service that is in progress.

<u>YouTube website</u> or app on mobile device: Search for Bethlehem United Church of Christ Ann Arbor. Once you find one of our previous videos, click on the link to our channel to see all past videos. Be sure to subscribe so that you can easily access our service every Sunday morning.
