#### **COMMUNITY PARTNER SNAPSHOT**

Are you familiar with Jewish Family Services (JFS)? I wasn't until recently and, like many seeing their name, had no idea that the largest number of people served are NOT Jewish. One's religious affiliation or lack thereof has no bearing on access to JFS services. It is based on need. The scope of community services they provide in Washtenaw County is broad and provides safety nets for much of the vulnerable population. Here are just a few highlights of services provided:

**Support for Seniors and Caregivers** – including care coordination with assistance from case managers (referral and resource navigation), crisis intervention, nutritional support, transportation, counseling & more.

#### **Nutritional Support through Nourish Nutrition Services** – including:

A specialty pantry that may be accessed twice monthly, with curbside pickup Thursdays 11-4:00 no appointment necessary. For emergency food needs, email nourish@jfsannarbor.org.

Congregate meals at the WISE Center at the J (Jewish Community Center of Ann Arbor) 3 days a week. Lunch is served Mondays and Wednesdays at noon, and Fridays at 12:30. Lunches are FREE to everyone over 60.

Meal Delivery is also available to homebound residents through the WISE Meals at Home program. The provide up to 10 kosher style and halal meals (5 lunch & 5 dinner) through their meals on wheels program. They also provide as well as medically-tailored meals for specialty populations and Medicaid recipients. Residents must be 60 or older, have medical documentation of homebound status and live within the JFS service area. To see if you qualify for meal delivery, contact JFS at nourish@ifsannarbor.org.

**Career Services** are offered to all unemployed and underemployed residents of Washtenaw County.

**Refugee and Immigrant support services** – including resettlement services, ESL classes, citizenship classes, employment assistance, assisting entrepreneurs achieve goals, small business hub (for business planning, financial literacy coaching, customer & employee retention best practices), digital literacy, as well as basic needs support for food and housing.

Like so many non-profit community services organizations, JFS has lost Federal funding. Therefore all donations and/or volunteer support would be greatly appreciated.


