IMPORTANT NOTICE BUILDING SAFETY AND SECURITY

Bethlehem utilizes a callbox system for building entry, as well as a separate call-button for Groundcover. We have recently installed a new doorbell camera at the 5th Avenue entrance for building tenants, and we will begin using this system for BUCC after-hours activities. This upgrade allows us to keep the 5th Avenue door locked while still providing secure, electronic access.

To help maintain a safe environment, we ask that you only allow individuals who are part of your group to enter with you. This ensures that each tenant including GroundCover and others—can manage access to their respective spaces and remain aware of who is entering the building.

If someone who is not part of your group asks to be let in—even if they are familiar to you—please respond politely: "I'm sorry, I can't let you in. Please contact the person or organization you're here to see so they can assist vou."

Thank you for your understanding and cooperation in helping keep our building safe for everyone.
