Reflections from Pastor Matthew

Beloveds,

When Travis and I moved into the church's parsonage just a few short weeks ago, there were already plenty of tasks on our "move-in" list. There was a plethora of boxes that needed to be organized and emptied. There were rooms that needed to be decorated with our flavor. We also needed to become accustomed to the little quirks of the house. Yet one of the first orders of business on my mind was bird feeders.

This is the first time Travis and I have had a backyard with active wildlife. About a year ago, I got really into birding as a form of self-care. There is something profoundly holy about intentionally tuning your ears away from the noise and choosing to hear the songs and chirps of the birds.

What began as an innocent download of the birding app "Merlin" soon became a new journey for me. As I began using the app, I realized how little I knew about birds. This became especially true as I acquired feeders. At first, I thought you just bought any kind of seed and feeder, hung it up somewhere, and...Boom. I would become Snow White. However, I have learned that birds have preferences.

Before Travis reluctantly "allowed" me to go to the hardware store, I did my homework. I began researching which seeds attract which birds. I knew I wanted more songbirds in the backyard, so I needed larger seeds and nuts with a mix of suet. If I wanted certain kinds of birds, I needed to offer something that would nourish them. I learned that I could not put out only the readily available seed and assume every bird in the neighborhood would flock to my backyard.

As with any profession, there are occupational hazards, and in pastoral ministry, mine is metaphors. Somewhere between listening to birds and meditating, I began to wonder if the same is true for building a church. I wonder if it begins with that kind of attention as well. Before we decide what people ought to want, we become curious about what nourishes them. What if we listened to people's questions, wounds, hopes, schedules, and spiritual hunger? I believe that hospitality cannot hinge on assumptions. True love makes us pay attention.

I have found that birdseed is only one part of the equation; birds also need shelter, safety, and a place to rest. What I'm catching on to is that the seed may, in fact, bring the birds to the backyard, but the environment determines whether the flock will flourish. I believe the church is the same: we must cultivate an ecosystem where people can become more fully alive.

After hanging a bird feeder, there is only so much I can do. I prepare the space, offer nourishment, and wait. I can't schedule the birds to come to my feeder on my Sabbath so that I can enjoy them. I think church building requires that same kind of patience. People may watch from a distance before deciding it's a safe space to land. We fill the feeder. We cultivate the environment. We keep watch.

Tornado Cleanup and Recovery Continues

The work to recover from the tornado damage in April is continuing, and we are grateful to see steady progress. All 28 fallen trees and their stumps have now been removed, the damaged fence has been restored, and repairs to the building's roof have been completed.

There is still work to be done. Additional tree trimming is needed, and plans are underway for asphalt repairs in areas where fallen tree roots lifted and damaged the pavement, leaving behind broken sections and potholes.

Tree and road maintenance are typically among our largest annual budget expenses. This year, however, the tornado has created additional and unexpected costs, leaving both our tree and road funds depleted.

If you are able, we would be grateful for a monetary donation to help offset these extraordinary expenses and support the continued care and maintenance of our property. Thank you for your generosity and for helping us move forward from this significant storm damage.

Habitat for Humanity Project

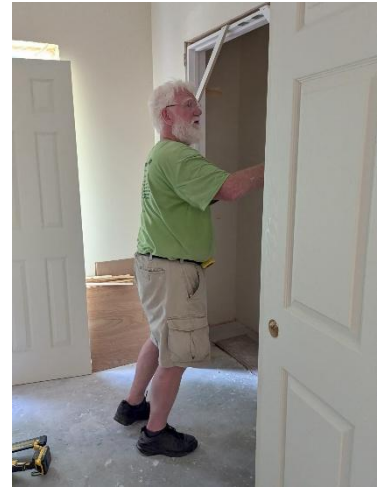
